Huffines is succeeding <u>Robert Rowling</u>, who has served as chairman since 2014. Huffines has been a member of the board since 2011 and will work with the foundation's president and CEO, <u>Kathleen Gibson</u>.

Huffines has been an active member of the foundation's executive committee and nominating committee, and has helped young leaders in the Cary Council drive awareness for the mission of the foundation and the UT Southwestern Medical <u>Center</u>. He has also served as the chairman of the UT System Board of Regents for more than four years. Additionally, he helped establish the <u>Dell</u> Medical School.

Huffines has more than 35 years of experience in banking and finance and most recently served as COO of subsidiaries of Hilltop Holdings. He holds a bachelor's degree in finance from the University of Texas at Austin and attended the Southwestern Graduate School of Banking at Southern Methodist University.
