Campaign for the Brain

In 2021, many of our Trustees and Honorary Trustees supported the successful Campaign for the Brain to build the Peter O'Donnell Jr. Brain Institute at UT Southwestern Medical Center. In partnership with UT Southwestern on its top priorities, Southwestern Medical Foundation created a special impact challenge for Campaign for the Brain, offering Trustees an opportunity to maximize their gifts through matching funds. The Foundation offered \$12.5 million in matching funds which – in addition to Foundation direct commitments – created a \$25 million campaign gift.

The O'Donnell Brain Institute is well on its way to becoming one of the nation's leading institutes in neuroscience discovery and an international referral destination for patients needing the best care for brain diseases today.

As a wide breadth of information is circulating about COVID-19 and its global impact, this has been a way to stay connected to reliable resources for updates and information. A **comprehensive list of resources** has been kept available to the public for this purpose.

As we move forward together, UT Southwestern is launching the new Peter O'Donnell Jr. School of Public Health to advance the field broadly through research and meet the need for an expanded workforce. With tremendous community support and a vision to embrace our region's diversity, eliminate disparities, and achieve optimal health for all, the new school will welcome its first class in the fall of 2023. This is the fourth school to be created at UT Southwestern and the first in the past half century. It will accompany the Medical School, School of Health Professions, and Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences on the UT Southwestern campus.

The past year signaled tremendous growth in impact for The Cary Council, the next generation of change-makers dedicated to advancing early-stage research at UT Southwestern. The Cary Council hosted a drive-thru version of their innovative, signature fundraising event, *An Evening with DocStars at Home*. The interactive nature of the 2021 celebration had the same distinguishing characteristics of past *An Evening with DocStars* events.

The event's drive-thru format provided guests with **take-home science experiments** designed by former grant recipients and inspired by their research in their respective labs.

Thanks to sponsors and supporters of this special celebration, The Cary Council was able to provide \$50,000 grants to each of three early-career researchers at UT Southwestern.
